<u>Total Solar Eclipse - Annie's Corner</u> Nature's Most Awesome Experience

For a Total Solar Eclipse (TSE) to occur, the Sun, Moon and Earth must be in a direct line. To see the TSE, you are in the Moon's shadow when it hits Earth. First, the sky will darken, like twilight. Then the Sun's corona, outer atmosphere of the Sun, will appear. The eyes must be protected with special glasses when watching this spectacle. Only when the Moon is completely blocking the sun can they be removed. Watching this memorable experience withing protection can damage your eyes and even for a short time may damage them permanently including blindness. In essence, it "cooks" your eyes. The rarity of this occurrence makes it so fascinating. A TSE of

the sun appears just once every 375 years. This event is visible from somewhere on earth about every 18 months but many of these events are only seen from remote locations. For any given place, for example where you live, a TSE appears just once each 375 years on average. In NYC, the last TSE was in 1925 and Chicago has not seen a TSE in 100 years. Interestingly enough, the city of Los Angeles has not seen one in 1,565 years. In Tucson, the last TSE was in the year 797.

On April 8 of this year, we are fortunate to have the TSE pass us. In the Northeast it will appear between 2:04 and 2:14 pm. Totality begins between 3:18 & 3:26 pm. Maximum between 3:20 and 3:27 pm. Ends between 3:22 & 3:29 pm Partial ends between 4:32 & 4:37 pm. The reason for the range is that I am taking figures from Buffalo (lowest) to Burlington (highest) and creating the range at this writing.


